Sibiu is one of the most important cultural centres of Romania and along with the city of Luxembourg, it was designated a European Capital of Culture for the year 2007. Formerly the centre of the Transylvanian Saxons, the old city of Sibiu was ranked as “Europe’s 8th most idyllic place to live” by Forbes.

The first official record referring to the Sibiu area comes from 1191, when Pope Celestine III confirmed the existence of a colony of German settlers in Transylvania, having its headquarters on the banks of the Cibin river, in a place named Cibinium at that time (and Sibiu at present). The first groups of colonists came from the western part of the Rhine; later on, they were joined by others from the central and southern parts of Germany. In the 14th century, Sibiu was already an important trade centre. It became the most important ethnic German city among the seven cities that gave Transylvania its German name Siebenbürgen (literally seven cities), and it was home to the Universitas Saxorum, the assembly of Germans in Transylvania.

During the XV-XVIII centuries, Sibiu became the most powerful fortress of Transylvania and one of the most flourishing and prosperous citadels. Pope Eugen the IVth called it “The Red Citadel” from the colour of the bricks used for its fortifications.
